UPDATE FROM THE WORSHIP COMMITTEE

The Worship Committee met virtually on Monday, May 4 and had a productive and creative meeting. A few take-aways of interest:

*We will begin filming much of the worship service back within the sanctuary, starting Sunday, May 10. Very few people will be present, all at appropriate social distances, and the church will be disinfected before and after. We believe this will allow for a little better filming experience, as well as providing the comfort of seeing the sanctuary! But please note---the building remains closed apart from this one exception!!

- *There will be an opportunity to celebrate Holy Communion virtually, within your home, on Pentecost, May 31. We will likely continue such a monthly experience as long as our present situation continues. More information will be available prior to that service.
- *We hope to provide red begonias for pick up on Pentecost Sunday, as if we were meeting at church together. Again, more information will be available prior to the 31st.
- * At present, there are no plans in place for in-person congregational worship through the month of May and likely beyond that. When we do begin to gather again, every precaution will be taken, and likely a virtual worship experience will also remain an option. We are currently forming a congregational Smart Team, at our Synod's request, to advise the Church Council on these matters.

COVID-19 COMMUNITY EFFORTS..UPDATE FROM DR. ANNE SKADBERG

Dear friends,

Thank you everyone for hunkering down and following the guidelines as laid out by the state. The plan is working to suppress the surge for the time being. We understand one is still coming, but hopefully we will be entering it with a bit more preparation and that it will be moderated in it's numbers. Plans A, B, C, and many more, have been made and we hope as we move into the phase of functioning in the presence of the virus we can stay in the less drastic plans. On that note, thank you mask makers, that will help and as you know they are being used!

In the clinics we have started delivering a lot of care by video and phone, and while different, we are finding it very effective for many things and anticipate we will continue to use it for those things after this passes. There remain things that are best or necessary to see in person and we do that. I see maybe one to three people in person a day right now. We are making our best effort to keep our clinics clean and safe places so if you are having a problem that you think should be addressed don't ignore it, particularly if is it something that could become complicated if ignored. We ask that people call ahead and review issues with triage staff so that we may direct them to the best channel. Often we begin to address with a virtual visit with phone or video and then the physician determines if the person needs to be seen or have further testing.

Certainly with COVID symptoms we are asking people to call ahead and we will direct to mobile testing sites or to the proper care site. If things ramp up, we will have a system for home hospital care as well trying to keep people in their homes while being monitored remotely. In the future this system may be used for folks with heart and pulmonary disease. We are having more advanced care planning discussions with people as well so that we are respecting their wishes.

I work with the Essentia system, but as I understand it, the above also holds true for the St. Lukes system.

As we move into things likely opening up a bit, it will remain and actually become more important that the elderly and those with risk factors continue to socially distance. There may be increased need for assisting with shopping, etc. So please ask for assistance if that would be helpful. And continue to pick up the phone to visit so we don't have social isolation.

We will be able to learn in the next few weeks how countries like Norway and Germany fare as they open up a bit. Chris keeps up with the Norwegian newspapers and his family. They locked down early and were able to mitigate their numbers, and now are opening up schools.

So thank you everyone for doing your part, it is making a difference. Continue to be smart, innovative, and patient as we move forward. This will require us to do things differently than we're used to for awhile.

Keep praying!... particularly for the scientists and the vaccine process.
