DEVOTION A Time to Lament

There is within the Scriptures, and particularly within the Psalms, a long history of lament: of the honest and sorrowful outpouring of the human heart before God. Psalm 130, for example, begins, "Out of the depths I cry to You, O God; hear my voice." Throughout the centuries countless numbers of faithful people have echoed such laments. The purpose of lament is to present before God our deepest griefs, fears, or conflicts, in a way that is genuine, but also in a way that acknowledges that God hears, cares, and will respond. Lament of this kind is an act of faith--not merely complaining or whining-- but a way to include God in the difficulties of our human condition and seek God's compassion and help.

I would suspect that many might join me right now in finding themselves in a place of lament. 2021 has gotten off to a difficult start both nationally and personally for a lot of us. Just last Wednesday, on the festival of Epiphany, we witnessed a shocking scene of violence and chaos as an angry mob stormed our nation's capitol building. This was something I had never expected to see in our country. Moreover, concerns continue that there could be further violence surrounding the upcoming inauguration; again, not at all the kind of behavior I expect of our fellow citizens. This is truly lamentable, and leaves many of us feeling sad, disheartened, angry, and confused. We rightly turn to God with this weight of emotion and bewilderment, both to express our pain and also to pray for protection, help, and healing for our government and nation.

Closer to home, it seems that many beloved members of our church and community are dealing with significant illnesses; cancer of various kinds, Covid-19 or its aftermath, mental health issues. Perhaps I am especially conscious of this, with my own husband scheduled for cancer surgery on Inauguration Day a week from today. But I feel like I could spend many hours in lament before God about the prevalence of illness and the need for healing. The death of my husband's brother, David, in New York this past weekend, adds yet another cause for grief, and we are hardly alone in grieving the deaths of those near and dear to us these days.

And then there's the pandemic itself.....which prevents us from putting our arms around those grieving or ill; from gathering in worship in-person to pray for our nation, our suffering friends and family members; from traveling to be a part of the response to the needs brought on by death or illness. There is hope on the horizon with the vaccine, but that doesn't answer our concerns right now. There is indeed much reason to lament. And I invite you to join me in lamenting, as people of faith who trust that God hears, cares, and responds. This is not faith*less* behavior, but faith*ful* prayer and action, and it stands within a long tradition of our heritage.

The powerful thing about psalms of lament, like Psalm 130, is that they also include an element of hope. Psalm 130 ends with these words: "I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope; my soul waits for the Lord more than those who watch for the morning... Oh hope in the Lord! For with the Lord there is steadfast love, and with him is great power to redeem."

With this hope in mind, I invite you to join me not only in lamenting, but in praying: praying for God's powerful protection, healing, help, and comfort---for our nation, our community, our family and friends. In Christ, Pastor Susan
