FROM THE PASTOR: 100 and the New Year

A few years ago, my devotional reading on New Year's Day morning was written by a Jewish woman who was recommending a practice promoted in the Talmud. The Talmud is a collection of Jewish sacred writings and commentary on the Scriptures that has been preserved over the centuries. The Talmudic practice she recommended was to give thanks to God for 100 things each day. 100 things! Each day! While I did not even attempt to try this as a daily spiritual practice, it did strike me as an appropriate way to begin that particular New Year. So, as Phil and I drove down to the Cities to visit family on that New Year's Day, I made a list of 100 things for which I thanked God. (Phil was driving, obviously!)

The benefit of such an extensive list is that it forces us to move from vague generalities...like, "I'm thankful for my family" or "I'm thankful for my health"... to far more specific and concrete reasons for thanksgiving. When you're coming up with a 100 reasons to give thanks, you start to think of things like this: I'm thankful for the warm, spiced taste of hot chai tea on a cold morning. I'm thankful for my husband's willingness to rub my tired feet after a long day. I'm thankful for how my Christmas cactus is bursting with pink blossoms against the backdrop of this snowy day. I'm thankful for good tires on our car to drive us safely to visit family. And so on...you get the idea!

My plan is to again list 100 things for which I'm thankful on New Year's Day, 2017. January is named for the Roman god, Janus, who was the god of beginnings, transitions, and time. He traditionally was portrayed as having two faces; one looking back towards the past, one looking forwards towards the future. We can see how appropriately this first month of the year is named. And pondering at least 100 reasons for thanksgiving is a way we may look both to the past and the future. For what are we grateful in the year that is past, 2016? Yes, it was in many ways a year of national and international turmoil and divisiveness, but for what are we thankful? And what do we look towards in 2017 with hopeful gratitude? Yes, we have no idea what this year will bring, and there are plenty of fears and dreads to go around as we look ahead. But, for what may we look forward with hope and gratitude? Because regardless of circumstances, God has become incarnate in Christ. Emmanuel, God With Us, will be present for us in the past, the future, and the now. Why not exercise our spiritual muscles a bit, and discover at least a hundred reasons for gratitude as we enter 2017?

Here is a lovely, traditional prayer for your consideration and use as we enter the New Year: Eternal God, you have placed us in a world of space and time, and through the events of our lives you bless us with your love. Grant that in the New Year we may know your presence, see your love at work, and live in the light of the event that gives us joy forever---the birth of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

WORSHIP IN JANUARY

This month we move from the season of Christmas to that of Epiphany. On January 1, we will observe New Year's Day, which is part of the 12 Days of the Christmas Season. Then we will move into the season of light and revelation that compromises Epiphany on Jan. 8. This season extends through Sunday, February 7.

Sunday, January 1-New Year's Day. We will use a traditional service this morning, including Holy Communion by intinction, as we get 2017 off to a blessed start! Pastor Paula Gaboury, from the United Church in Two Harbors, will be our guest preacher.

Sunday, January 8- Epiphany/Baptism of our Lord. We will celebrate the coming of the Magi to bring gifts to the Christ child on this morning, using a traditional service and receiving Holy Communion at the altar. We will also observe the festival of the Baptism of our Lord. As part of that observance, we will renew our own baptismal faith.

Sunday, January 15-A Sunday in Epiphany. We will utilize our Bread of Life Celebration Service as we commune by intinction on this morning.

Sunday, January 22-A Sunday in Epiphany. We will worship with a traditional style this Sunday, including receiving Holy Communion by intinction. A time for healing prayer will be included. The annual meeting potluck brunch will follow.

Sunday, January 29-A Sunday in Epiphany. Our We Are Called Service will provide our worship framework, including communion by intinction.


